An act to add *Section 39034.5 to, and Chapter 8 (commencing with Section 39930) to Part 2 of Division 26 of and to repeal Section 39931.1 of, the Health and Safety Code, relating to air pollution.*

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2332, as amended, Keeley. Air pollution: indoor air pollution. Under existing law, the State Air Resources Board is the state agency charged with coordinating efforts to attain and maintain ambient air quality standards. Existing law requires the state board to identify toxic air contaminants that are emitted into the ambient air of the state. Existing law also requires the state board to adopt airborne toxic control measures to reduce the emissions of toxic air contaminants from nonvehicular sources. ~~Existing law authorizes the Department of Pesticide Regulation to develop control measures, as specified, for pesticides, as defined.~~

This bill would require the state board to develop and establish a program for the prevention and control of pollution in indoor air, as defined, that includes education, community outreach, and emission standards for products that are primarily used or located indoors. The bill would require the state board, by January 1, 2004, in consultation with the State Department of Health Services, any other state agency the
